Meet Jody Romano!

What is your role at CFGP?

I am the Chief Advancement Officer for CFGP. My primary responsibility is helping to facilitate the creation of new funds to help donors support the Catholic organizations most meaningful to them. I also help promote the mission of our partner organizations so the entire Catholic community can learn about them and understand their work.

How long have you been with CFGP? In that time, what has been your favorite memory?

I have been with CFGP for six months, starting just four business days before Philadelphia closed due to the pandemic. My favorite memory to-date would be during one of my first Zoom calls with a partner organization when my cat, Amelia, decided to join us by jumping up on my lap. Everyone smiled and welcomed her to the call and we did not miss a beat. It was nice to see everyone share a funny moment in the midst of this "temporary reality" we find ourselves in.

Why do you choose to work in the nonprofit sector?

I work in nonprofit because I love working for a mission I believe in. I have been very blessed over the years to be connected to causes that are important to me.

If you could start your own charity, what would be its mission?

I would like to run an advocacy organization for eldercare. Too many seniors do not have the support they need when it comes to managing the very confusing terrain of their own care. Also, many families need help when trying to navigate these same pathways for someone they love. I would like to create an organization that helps these people so they can grow older with dignity, grace, and support.

Focused on Faith-Collaborating with the Office for the New Evangelization

The Office for the New Evangelization of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia has partnered with the Fellowship of Catholic University Students (FOCUS) to bring their new Parish apostolate to our local Church. FOCUS began their parish work within the Archdiocese of Philadelphia last year with an initial grant from CFGP that enabled the ministry to begin their work, while this year's grant will help FOCUS continue to expand here over the next two years. To date, CFGP has granted nearly \$100,000 to FOCUS in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, with this year's grant totaling \$74,000.

FOCUS has been one of the Church's most impactful apostolates for evangelization. Their ministry has a proven track record of numerous conversions of young people on college campuses, many vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life, and strong marriages. Currently, FOCUS is present on 153 campuses and has more than 800 missionaries. But while FOCUS began at universities, its recent work has expanded to parish communities.

During this second year of the partnership, a FOCUS missionary will begin service at St. Agnes Parish in Sellersville. In addition, FOCUS will host events and workshops for parish leaders to impart their highly effective model of discipleship to clergy, lay people and religious so that more and more parishes can implement the FOCUS model of missionary disciple-making. The bulk of CFGP's grant will fund the work of the parish missionary at St. Agnes Parish under the leadership of the pastor, Fr. Jeff Stecz.

"This is a particularly exciting endeavor because we are partnering with FOCUS at the beginning of their outreach to parishes. I sense that we are trailblazing alongside FOCUS in this new dimension of their ministry," said Meghan Cokeley, Director of the Office for the New Evangelization. "I am thrilled that the Church of Philadelphia can be a part of this new movement of the Lord. CFGP has made that possible, and I am so very grateful!"

COVID-19: Physically distanced, spiritually united



Emergency Relief Fund

As the world tried to grapple with this newfound coronavirus and the havoc it was wreaking across the globe, there was nothing we could do except watch it unfold. Before we knew it, businesses were shutting their doors indefinitely, offices were sending their staff home, a lock down was instituted across most of the country, and millions of Americans lost their jobs.

But despite the turmoil, we knew life had to go on, and that we had to do our part to pick up the pieces. We contacted our partners at Catholic Social Services (CSS), who are on the front lines of our region's most vulnerable communities every day, and discussed the most critical needs of their clients. The verdict was clear, with the loss of jobs and in turn income, food insecurity was rising.

Our team gathered virtually and devised a plan to help CSS feed their rapidly growing client base. We set up a new fund as quick as we could, the Emergency Relief Fund (ERF), that serves as an urgent response to the needs of those impacted by the pandemic. The Fund was established, the need was immediate, all there was left to do was pray that the community would step up and help usand you did.

The ERF launched less than one week before we were able to make our first distribution, a \$30,000 gift to St. John's Hospice, a ministry that serves homeless men in Philadelphia. We and CSS were so grateful for the outpouring of generosity we were seeing from our community, and it only continued.

Today, the ERF has raised nearly \$270,000 and is still actively making distributions to the food pantries in the area. As the pandemic persists, so does the need for food, and so the ERF's work continues.



Parish Support Initiative

In addition to those experiencing food insecurity, another community was also severely impacted by the pandemic-our parishes. With the temporary suspension of public Masses in the spring, their weekly offertories were severely impacted.

Again, our team assembled and discussed possible ways to help. We consulted leaders in our Archdiocese, as well as parishioners, to determine the best course of action. We evaluated the response and determined the most urgent need was to somehow provide an avenue for parishes to still receive a weekly offertory, even amid the suspension of public Masses. This spurred the launch of our second COVID-19 relief effort, the Parish Support Initiative (PSI).

The PSI was developed in collaboration with the Archdiocese of Philadelphia as a response to the immediate needs of our faith communities. This initiative provided parishes with the additional stream of income they were missing. This opportunity was open to all parishes within the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, and Archbishop Nelson J. Pérez, Archbishop of Philadelphia, provided guidance on how to participate during his livestream Sunday Masses.

CFGP provided a donation platform for every parish in the Archdiocese that was housed on our website. Parishes were encouraged to share the link with their parishioners so they could visit the site, select their home parish from a dropdown menu, and donate to it. Donors were also given the option to select "Parish Most in Need" from the menu, in which their gift was allocated to parishes that are facing extreme financial crises because of the pandemic.

To date, the Parish Support Initiative has raised more than \$173,000 for over 121 parishes.



MOVING FORWARD: Parish Stewardship Renewal

Our work continues as we navigate this new era of philanthropy, stewardship, and charity. So many things around us are changing, but our goal remains the same: to help as many people as possible. Our third and most recent COVID-19 relief effort, the Parish Stewardship Renewal, follows its predecessor in supporting Archdiocesan parishes impacted by the pandemic. But the Parish Stewardship Renewal will shift its focus to healing, growth, and hope for the future. This project, officially titled MOVING FORWARD: Parish Stewardship Renewal, offers parishes within the Archdiocese of Philadelphia an opportunity to participate in an individualized offertory restoration and enhancement plan customized for their parish.

To address both the short and longterm effects of COVID-19 on our parish offertories, we're providing multiple phase opportunities and tailored options to address the individual needs of each parish community. We're also offering this opportunity with our staff time waived, and for parishes in severe crises, assistance with printing and postage costs.

These three initiatives were created to spark hope. We want all those struggling in our communities to know we're here for them, in good times and bad, and after seeing how you've stepped in to help, we know you're here for them too. We can't thank you enough for your support.
